Key Responsibilities:

The Individual Support Teacher will:

- Report to the Individual Needs Coordinator and under the supervision of an assigned Class Teacher;
- Demonstrate a passion for inclusion and the skills required to adapt learning experiences, instructions and resources quickly and efficiently;
- Support the academic and social development of an assigned student within the context of a busy Key Stage 2 classroom across and beyond the curriculum;
- Contribute to the construction, delivery and review of an Individual Education Plan;
- Attend meetings and development sessions, as required;
- Be available on campus within term time between the hours of 07:30 and 15:30.

Professional Expectations:

The Individual Support Teacher will:

- Have excellent communication and interpersonal skills;
- Have experience of working with children presenting needs commonly associated with the Autistic spectrum, to include inattentiveness and impulsivity;
- Have experience of adapting learning resources for children who are not meeting age-related expectations;
- Be conscientious, efficient and organised;
- Be keen to learn;
- Demonstrate a good level of spoken and written English;
- Chinese language skills would be advantageous.

All candidates are required to provide accurate and detailed information about their employment history and the school will carry out background checks on the successful candidate to assess their suitability to work in a school.
